

"It's BIG and PODGY," said Akif.


"It's GREEN and SPOTTY," said Rani.




"Now where did I keep my glasses?" asked Masterji during Maths class.

"Look behind you, Masterji," said Bishal. "The frog is wearing your glasses!"


"Never mind, I can see just as well without them."


