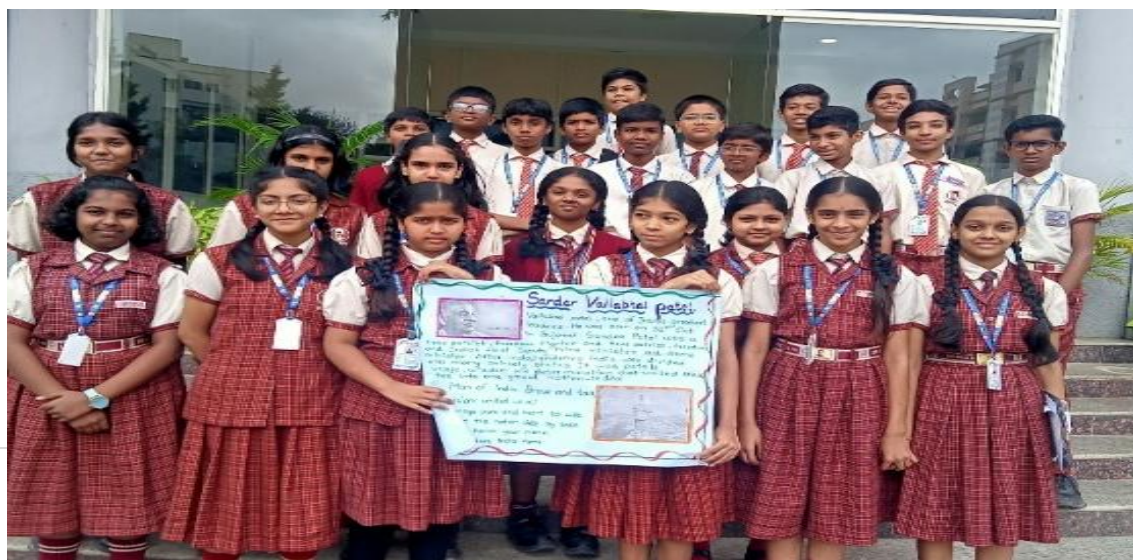
Assembly by Class IX Jasmine – *Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat*
