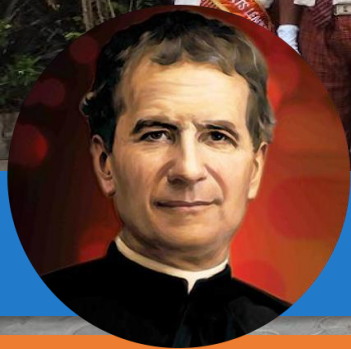

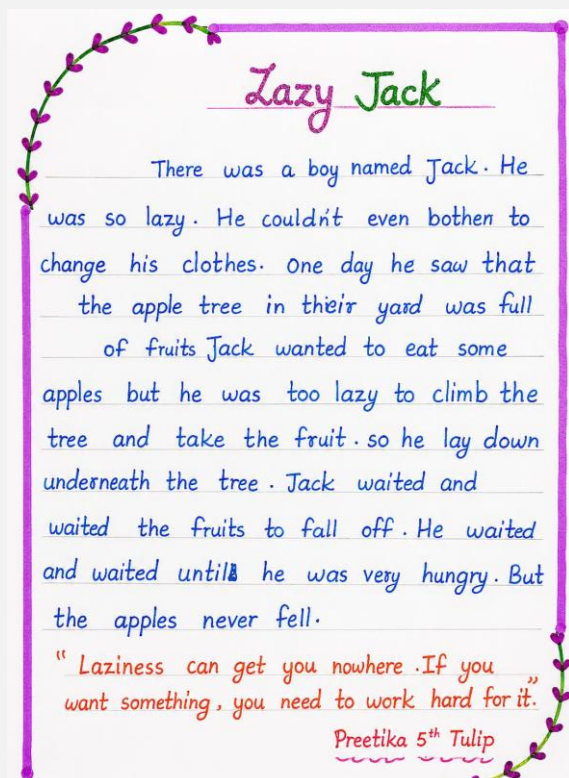
Nursey-pre- Primary Strokes Activities

Parents-Teachers Meeting (PTM) 25 July

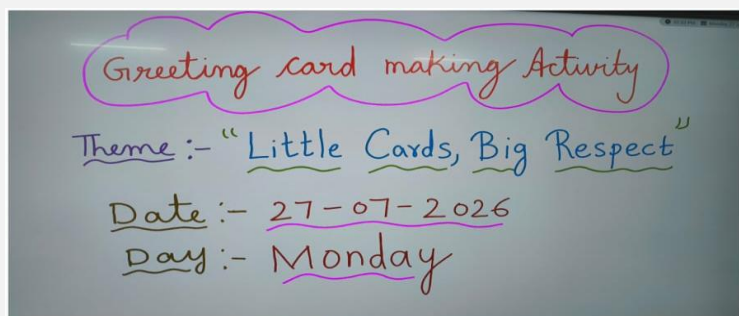

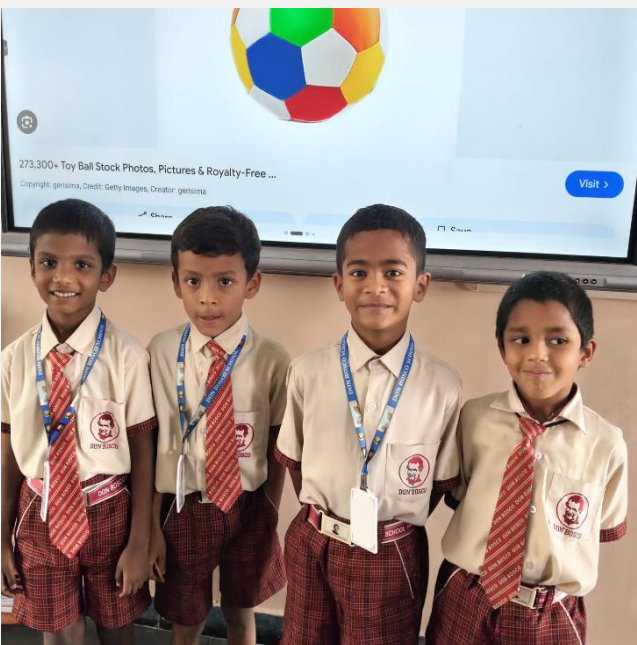

IIT Foundation: Talent Test- 1

As you all aware that, IIT Foundation classes play a vital role in preparing students for competitive examinations by strengthening their conceptual understanding and problem-solving abilities. As a part of this preparation, **Talent Test-1** was conducted successfully to assess the students' knowledge, analytical skills, and exam readiness.

The primary objective of conducting Talent Test-1 was to help students evaluate their current level of preparation and identify areas that require improvement. The test was designed in a competitive examination pattern, enabling students to gain confidence and experience in handling objective-type questions under timed conditions.

To familiarize students with national-level entrance examination practices, **OMR (Optical Mark Recognition) sheets** were provided for answering the test. The use of OMR sheets helps students develop accuracy in marking responses, improve time management skills, and reduce examination anxiety by giving them exposure to the format commonly used in competitive exams such as JEE and Olympiads. In addition, we are planning to introduce a **reward system** to encourage academic excellence and healthy competition among students.
